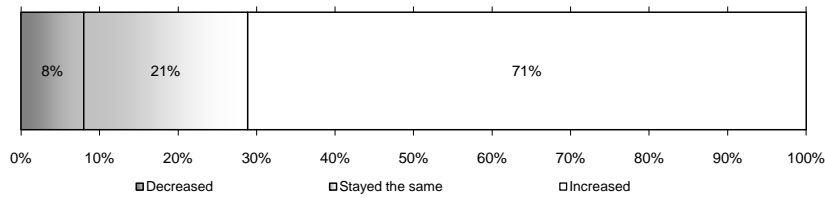

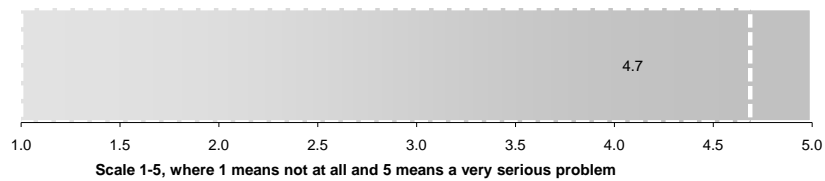

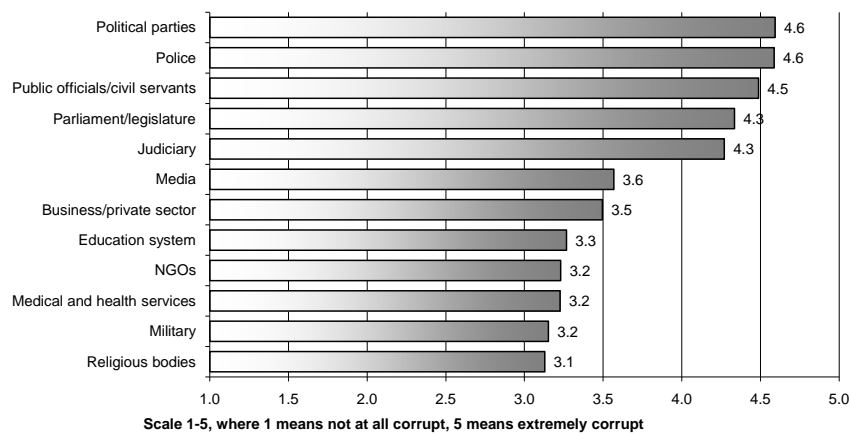
**Figure 1: Change in level of corruption in past 2 years**



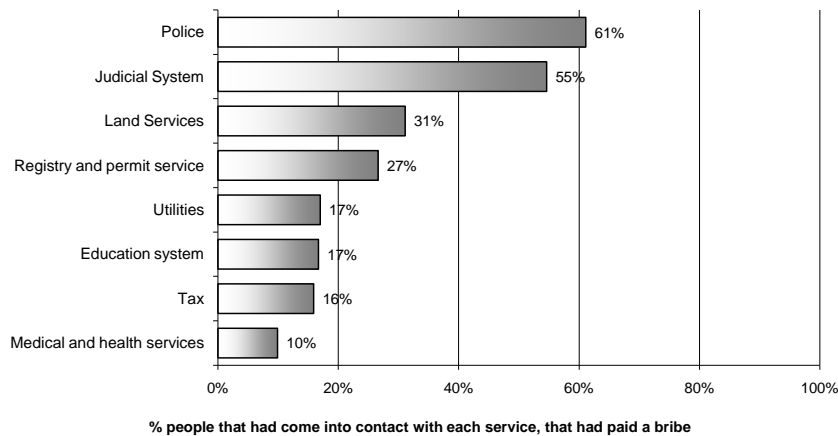
**Figure 2: How big a problem corruption in the public sector?**

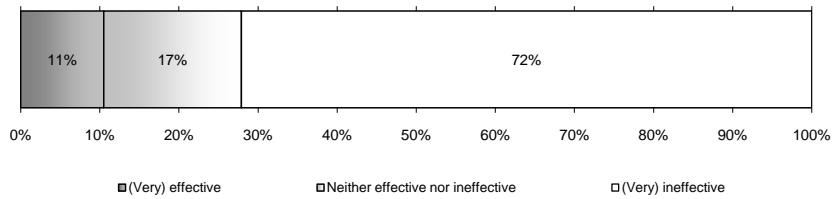
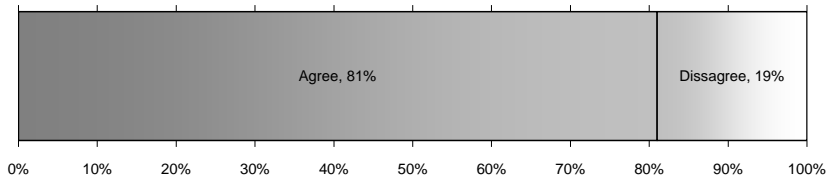
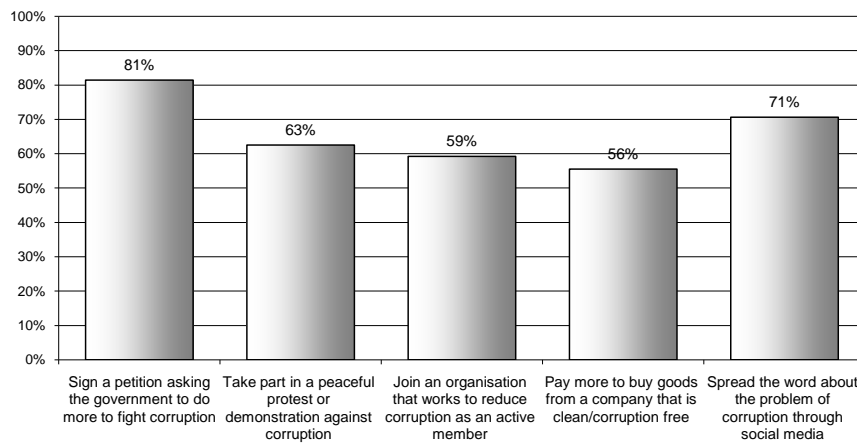
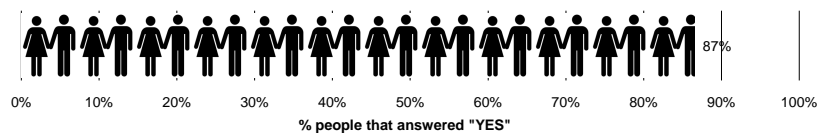


**Figure 3: Perceptions of corruption, by institution**
